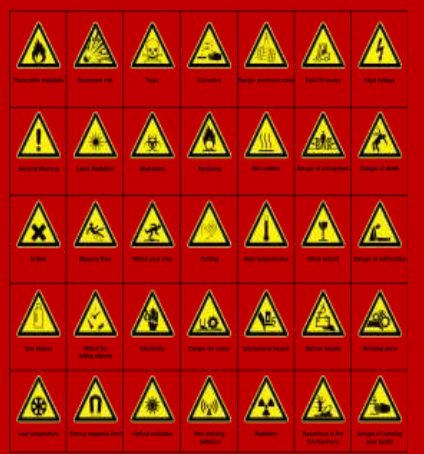

# Do Not Put Yourself in Danger

- Do Not Wade into Flooding Streams
- Be Non-Confrontational



- Do Not Touch Unknown Substances
- Expect the Unexpected

Big Rule: Remember, your safety and the safety of others is of the utmost importance.

# No Trespassing



1. Be Aware of Property Lines & Who Owns What
2. Get Proper Permission
3. Do Not Damage Property

Big Rule: Treat others as you would want to be treated.

# Avoid Hazards

Hazards like spills, incidences, leaks or areas with poor air quality...

- Report Hazards to Proper Authority

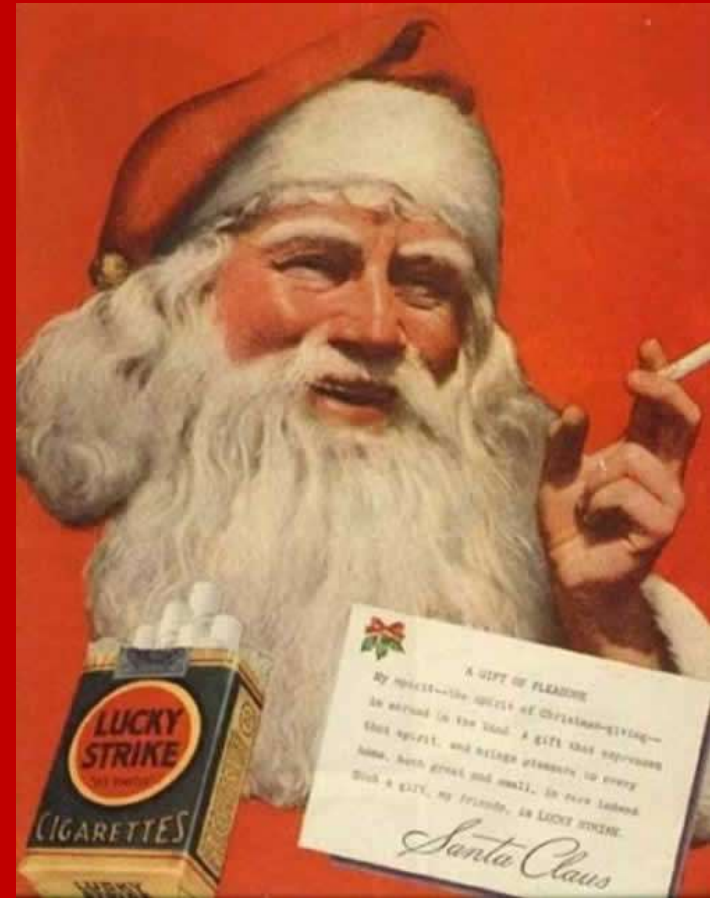
(911, PADEP, PFBC, etc.)

- Document Hazards from a Safe Distance



# No Open Flames

Never bring open flames or equipment that can spark near gas wells & equipment.



Big Rule: Fire is bad!

# What to Report

Things to report to the proper authorities...

- Fires
- Spills
- Poor Air Quality
- Accidents
- Poor Water Quality
- Fish Kill
- Sickness
- Erosion & Sediment
- Noise Violations
- Zombie Uprisings



# Who Do I Report it To?

Save yourself some hassle, report complaints to the right place...



1. Fires, Spills, Accidents, Gas Leaks & Sickness – 911 & Operator
2. Poor Air Quality & Poor Water Quality – PADEP
3. Fish Kill – PFBC & PADEP
4. Erosion & Sediment – PADEP or CD
5. Noise Violations - Municipality

Big Rule: Don't cry wolf, report only legitimate complaints!
